The Fuel Oil Pump - What You Need to Know

Over the years, there have been several companies that have tried to market the standard Fuel Oil Pump. The most common residential pumps used here in the USA are the Beckett, Suntec, Danfoss and Webster. Although there have been some changes in the pumps, the manufacturers have one goal in mind, which is to provide a pump that will meet the service demands of the trade and the equipment manufacturers.

I'm sure most of you know that pressure and vacuum capabilities are two of the most important

functions of the oil pump. When it comes to pressure, I would hope that everyone working in the trade realizes that pressure settings depends on the manufacturer. Back in the early stages of the industry, the common out of the box or the OEM was always 100 PSI, which is of course unless someone decided to become an overnight engineer. I will agree, that in the past when there was a combustion issue, it was not unusual for a burner **M**anufacturer's **T**ech **S**ervice to suggest raising the pumps pressure and reducing the nozzle size, or perhaps using a secondary nozzle.

There may be a few new burner technicians, who are still curious as to the difference between a single and two stage pump. The answer is, the (most popular) single stage has one set of gears to provide both suction and pressure, while the two stage has two sets of gears, one for pressure and the other for suction. The single stage is generally used when the oil supply is below the burner and a vacuum of 10" or less. The two-stage suction gear set create a vacuum in order to lift the oil from a tank that is below the appliance. That same gear moves the oil into the pumps chamber so that the pressure gear can take over and supply the necessary pressure that will allow the burner nozzle to atomize at the burner manufacturers specified pressure and pattern. (Check the current OEM guides).

Another important function other than building pressure, is the pumps cut-off ability, this is also controlled by a pressure regulating spring within the pump that will open when the preset pressure is achieved. This prevents the fuel from entering the nozzle at an improper pressure, which in turn effects the burners' overall performance.

The pump manufactures are now producing pumps that have a solenoid valve that will also support a clean cut-off. Since Bio Fuel became a reality, tradesmen complained of seal leaks. Although true in the beginning, the composition of the pump seals were updated and for the most part I have not heard any more issues. Some manufacturers have labeled their pumps packaging as Bio Fuel approved.

I hope that every technician has purchased a fuel pump test kit that includes the gauges required to evaluate the performance of the pump. In case you're not aware, several of the pumps are now produced in Europe. (Check type of


Rhode Island Chapter Clam Bake
