Oil Tank Failures: A Growing Problem

I know those of you who have been in the oil business for several years have seen your share of annual oil tank failures along with high clean-up costs.

We seem to simply attribute this to age, which can be 30-40 years. (Look for the date generally found on the plate welded on the top of the older tanks or the sticker on the new tanks.)

These tanks can be of sizes ranging from the common 275-gallon basement or exterior tanks to the 500 and 1,000-gallon tanks traditionally used for underground

applications. These same tanks are generally of 7-gauge thickness, while the basement tanks are normally 12-gauge.

I'm amazed to hear that companies, when surveying for a new heating system, never look at the oil tank that in most cases is as old

as the heating equipment being replaced. I would prefer to see that the customer is made aware of this fact and given the opportunity to give their home a clean bill of health by replacing the tank.

What are some of the causes of oil tank failure besides age?

In most cases, the cause has been attributed to deterioration due to water, sludge and other contaminates at the tank's bottom for several years. But how does water get in the tank?

There are several ways: In an underground tank, we often find the age-old black iron fill or vent pipe has rotted out below ground or a



leak that can be the result of groundwater contamination.

In either the basement or exterior 275, the fill cap may have been left off in error during a delivery, the gauge vial may be broken, or it could be condensation that can occur during the summer months when the oil is

left under one quarter of a tank.

In talking to several oil company managers and oil tank-only installers, I'm told that they are experiencing a larger than normal number of basement oil tank failures.

One company mentioned that they

have replaced 53 of the 275 tanks this year. I have asked for their thoughts as to the reason for the increase in the failure rate. I'm hearing that Bio Fuel could be the contributor.

I can neither agree or disagree to this suggestion, as I have no knowledge of any facts or studies that can support this suggestion. I have also heard that some tank insurance companies, which have offered a tank insurance policy covering the leaking (cont'd on page 11)



oil tank replacement, are getting away from these policies due to the increase in tank failures.

So, what can be done to reduce oil tank failures? You may remember. many years ago, the round silver ball the size of a nickel with embossed seams. When dropped into the tank, it was offered as the fix-all to oil tank issues. Did it really work? You tell me! There are also many chemicals sold that are supposed to remove sludge and water from the tank.

There are also ultrasonic testing devices that can measure the density of the steel in the bottom of the tank. The accuracy is determined by the testing of the entire tank bottom.

Many companies are moving away from the standard steel basement tanks and installing the double wall tanks. One of these manufacturers also offers a one-milliondollar insurance policy should a leak occur.



In closing, keep in mind with the high cost of a basement tank replacement - generally in the \$1,500 to \$2,000 range - more oil customers are converting to an alternative fuel. Finally, I would suggest more companies consider installing an Oil Safety Valve on every tank installation.
